Several social media sites including Awash Post reported last night's blasts at Jimma Abba jfar International Airport that killed and injured several people. He also wrote that the airport had been closed following the blast and that flights to Jimma had been canceled.

However, the Ethiopian airline Dismissed the claim made in the post. "Ethiopian Airlines, for its part, denied the allegations, saying, "Our regular airport and flights are currently operating normally in Jimma."
